

PCTE Assistant Teacher Course 2024

Prepare your staff with the foundation of Montessori philosophy!

Description:

The asynchronous Montessori Assistant Course is recommended for assistants in Infant-Toddler, Early Childhood and Elementary classrooms, staff members who are new to Montessori, administration, caregivers, and employees who may not work directly with children but share their community. This course **can be taken at any time of the year** and covers the overall guiding principles that create a successful Montessori classroom. Details in Montessori philosophy and the management of the classroom will be covered in order to understand the application of principles, such as: grace and courtesy, respect, individualized learning and independence. Videos and photos are included as valuable resources to demonstrate lessons, show shelf design, and model preparation of the environment.

This class includes 20 hours of content and an option to submit reflection papers for a professional development certificate of 30 hours. A PCTE facilitator will respond to all submissions.
